

The Crop Water Use Report is back for 2024!





Every Monday from June to September, the Upper Niobrara White NRD provides a crop water use report based on data collected across the District to help producers monitor water needs for various crops in each growth stage while taking into account the precipitation received during that week. The UNWNRD is able to provide this report with the help of several landowners across the District who call in to report their precipitation and evapotranspiration (ET) readings. The data is then compiled and the report is generated to help producers anticipate how much water may be needed throughout the next week. This information helps to conserve water while helping producers increase yield and save in energy costs.

The UNWNRD is always looking for additional producers to report, so please call if you are interested in providing data to help generate this report!




Water Use >

The 2023 average water use within each township across the District for irrigation purposes.

Sub-areas 4 and 6 are currently in the last year of a five year allocation limiting water use to 65 acre inches over that five year period.

Irrigation flow meters are read each fall to determine the amount of groundwater used during the irrigation season.





RD information

< Water Quality

The average nitrate concentration of the most recent samples taken from wells within each township across the District.

Nitrate concentrations of less than 10 parts per million (ppm) is considered safe for human consumption.

UNWNRD tests domestic wells yearly for District residents free of charge!

< Water Levels

The average change in static groundwater level or depth to groundwater within each sub-area across the District from spring 2023 to spring 2024.

UNWNRD Staff measures static groundwater levels from several observation wells once in the fall and again in the spring in order to monitor changes in the water table from year to year.
